MICHELLE STEEL
Vice Chair, Board of Equalization

Elected to the Board of Equalization in 2006, Michelle Steel serves as the country's highest ranking Korean-American officeholder and California's highest ranking Republican woman. In 2011, Steel was unanimously elected by her colleagues to serve as Vice Chair of the Board of Equalization. A successful businesswoman and renowned taxpayer advocate, Steel represents more than eight million people in the Third District, which includes the counties of Imperial, Orange, Riverside, San Diego, and portions of Los Angeles and San Bernardino.

Steel has spent her life actively involved in her community, beginning as a Radio Seoul Commentator- a position she held from 1993 to 2008. She was an instrumental volunteer for several youth organizations, including Options House, a local emergency shelter helping runaway children, and the Coalition of Brothers and Sisters Unlimited, an African-American after-school program.

Her public policy experience includes service as a Member of the California Orange County Deputy District Office: KA Community Commission and Member of the Tax Advisory Committee for the State Board of Equalization. She has served on the President's Advisory Commission on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, California World Trade Commission, L. A. County Department of Children and Family Services, and Los Angeles Airport and Fire Commissions. The President appointed Steel to the White House Conference on Aging. Steel also serves as a Board Member for the Korean American Republican Association.

Educated in Korea, Japan, and the United States, Steel holds a degree in Business from Pepperdine University, an Executive MBA from the University of Southern California's Marshall School of Business, and is fluent in Korean and Japanese. Steel and her husband, Shawn, live in Palos Verdes, with their two children, Cheyenne 23, and Siobhan 20.

General Assignment Reporter
Fox40 News at 10

A Sacramento native and an active volunteer for numerous community activities, Lonnie Wong brings a vast local perspective and over 30 years of reporting experience to FOX40 News at 10.

Since 1980, Wong has worked in many capacities at KTXL including assignment editor, field producer, political correspondent, producer and host of numerous public affairs shows and currently as general assignment reporter. For many years he was the only Asian American reporter in the State Capitol Press Corps and has covered state politics under six governors. He has been recognized on the floor of the State Assembly and also by the Asian Pacific Islander Joint Legislative Caucus for his journalistic excellence and work with the Asian and Pacific Islander communities.

His commitment to the local community is evident in his numerous outreach activities including past President and current board member of the Sacramento Chapter of the Asian American Journalists Association, founding board member of the Chinese American Council of Sacramento, President and current member of the Asian Pacific Rim Foundation, and a founding and current member of the Pacific Rim Street Fest Organizing Committee. He has also served on the board of the Sacramento Chinese Community Service Center and the Sacramento Chinese Historical Project among many others.

A graduate of the C.K. McClatchy High School in Sacramento, Sacramento City College, and the University of California, Davis (Bachelor of Arts in English), Wong continues to make a difference in our local community.



MONA PASQUIL

Appointments Secretary for the Governor

Mona Pasquil currently serves as Appointments Secretary in the Office of Governor Jerry Brown. She is the first Filipino-American to be appointed to this position in the state's history and is responsible for helping the Governor build his administration and recruit top candidates to serve the state.

Prior to her appointment, Pasquil served as Chief of Staff to California Lieutenant Governor John Garamendi and Acting Lieutenant Governor, after Garamendi was elected to Congress. This marked the first time a woman, Asian Pacific Islander or Filipino-American served in this role. For this achievement, Pasquil was awarded a Presidential Citation by Philippine President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo.

Pasquil is a veteran political advisor and strategist, serving as President of Pasquil Associates & Strategic Communications for more than three decades and directing presidential, gubernatorial, and local campaigns across the nation. Her work includes serving as political director for twice-elected California Governor Gray Davis, Deputy CEO for the 2000 Democratic National Convention in Los Angeles, California political director for the Gore/Lieberman campaign, western political director for the White House Office of Political Affairs under President Bill Clinton and member of the Democratic National Committee from 2003 to 2009. In addition to working with California and Washington's heaviest political hitters, Pasquil also worked as a strategic consultant for IBM's national, state and local government sales team

Pasquil is most proud of her work mentoring California's youth to become more active in their communities. This work includes founding the Asian Pacific Youth Leadership Project of California, an organization dedicated to boosting Asian and Pacific Islander youth involvement in California policy.

Pasquil has received numerous awards, including the 2010 JFK "Profiles in Courage" Award from the Los Angeles County Democratic Party and the Torchbearer Award by the Asian Pacific Islander Capitol Association.

Pasquil, the daughter of a gifted jazz pianist and community volunteer, grew up listening to all-night jam sessions and loves to sing. She lives in the Sacramento River Delta with her husband Chris and their dog Manny.

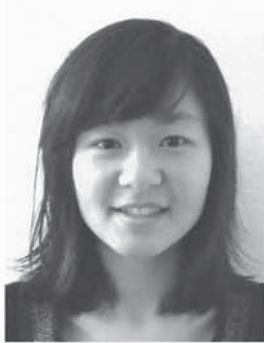
Leslie Kushida

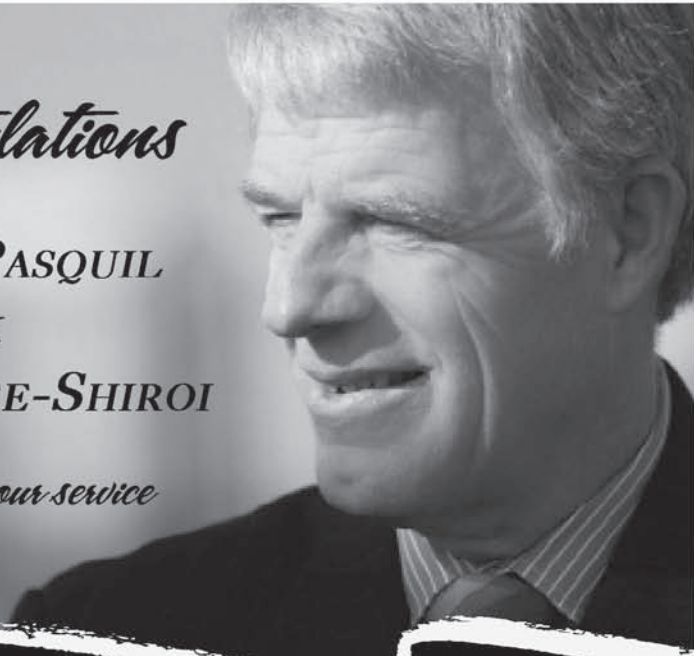
